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Governance, Health & Administration Committee Minutes
Monday, May 11th, 2020 10:00 AM

Reports to the Committee

Auditor A. Palmer stated that the audit is delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The office has been taking social distancing. It is not due to any shortage of staff in the auditor's office. The external auditors, UMR, and other entities as well as other offices have all been working from home, causing a delay in the audit. Layoffs are due to shortage of revenue within the County and hiring anyone into the office from a layoff would not be possible.

D. Beck asked what the practical effect of the delay.

Ms. Palmer stated that she still plans to have the audit draft from the external auditors perhaps in June.

L. Boswell-Loftin asked how many people the auditor's office has had to lay off.

Ms. Palmer stated that she has not had to lay anyone off at this time. She also stated that the County has not run into difficulty with paying County bills.

County Clerk K. Kinney reported that the health and safety of all employees is very important to her office and is taking every precaution necessary with hand sanitizer, and disinfecting wipes. The office is looking at ordering plexi glass for the front desk in the office. She stated the office is only taking 2 marriages a day



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between 2-3 by appointment only, and all parties must wear masks and have a temperature taken. She stated the office is looking at a possible lay off, but stressed she needs staff during the elections. She also stated the office has tables in front of the counter for increased distancing between the public and staff.

Member D. Beck asked if the same number of polling place would be in effect for November. Clerk Kinney stated that she hopes for a vote by mail but was unsure if that would happen and there is always trouble hiring election judges.

Member B. Vyncke asked about comparative costs voting by mails versus voting in person . Clerk Kinney stated that the office would be responsible for mailing voting by mail application County wide and expects that cost would be an additional \$50,000 but election judges and maintaining voting equipment cost would be saved. That cost would be on top of mailing out the voters cards due to postage.

Member D. Mielke asked about the vote by mail ballot roster would be determined. K. Kinney stated that a ballot would have to be requested.

Chairman J. Deppe asked if COVID-19 Protocols would be enforced if polling places would be open during the election. K. Kinney stated that they would have temperature taken and that they would have to comply with protocols.

Circuit Clerk T. Weikert stated that it was a very challenging week in her office due to the number of layoffs. she is hopeful as the State, County and Courts begin to open that she will be able to bring employees back. She is looking at ordering dividers for certain areas of the office for decreased exposure. She also stated the office is using different methods and utilizing Zoom meetings to help with filings. Plexiglas will be installed so payments can be received in the office as well. In April 2020 there are a little over 600 filings with limited court schedule and access to the courthouse. No foreclosures or evictions are being filed at this time. This has a profound effect on workload and staff. Once opened up again, she stated that she has concerns on the number of waivers that will come through. There will also be a reduced number of individuals allowed in the courthouse at any time once reopened which reduces the amount of clerks needed in the office.

Captain D. Hart from the Sherriff's office stated that opening sales back on the 19th utilizing a storage facility. Those sales generate about \$6,000 per sale, which will generate revenue. There is a smaller inmate population which reduces feeding costs and lower court security costs as well. He did state an increase in calls for service as well.



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County Administrator J. Snider reported on items relation current 4 residents. Staff is following all recommended protocols and monitoring residents and staff accordingly

There was a MOU for hazard pay for anyone working the COVID-19 units ; there will be a \$2 per hour and a \$50 attendance bonus signed last week through the end of May.

He stated the officeholders have been addressing their staffing in relationship to revenues. The remained of office holders who have not made announcements are considering accordingly.



PROCLAMATION

Racial Disparity, Inequity, and Violence

Whereas the death of George Floyd in police custody is both a singular tragedy and an emblem of the deep and systemic racism that stands in the way of our shared task to form a more perfect union, and

Whereas, across the country fellow citizens who are Persons of Color have been and continue to be victimized by police violence incommensurate with the severity of the crimes - actual and alleged - involved in their police interactions, and

Whereas, a profound debt of gratitude is owed by all citizens of Rock Island County to the committed and conscientious professionals who make up the vast majority of law enforcement in our community, who by their statements and actions join us in seeking an end to racial violence, and

Whereas, peaceful protest in the face of injustice is both a right and an obligation of those who, motivated by conscience, seek to effect positive change in their communities and this great nation,

Whereas, arbitrary violence of all kinds is condemnable, whether it is effected by those perpetrating criminal activity, or it is ordered by civil authorities against those engaged in peaceful protest,

Now therefore be it resolved that the Rock Island County Board stands with those who seek to constructively address racial disparity and inequity in all its forms, and be it further resolved that

Rock Island County supports dialogue and action to confront racial violence in all its forms, including ensuring that law enforcement training and certification in anti-bias and de-escalation be improved and made uniform across our county in order to end forever practices that have for too long abrogated the hallowed American principle of equal treatment before the law, and be it further resolved that

All citizens of good conscience are asked to consider what they might do to live up to the commission given us by the Founders of the United States of America to establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity.
