We offer many opportunities for interns to heighten their legal skills and observe the practical applications of our local prosecutor's office to the overall criminal justice system. We try to provide a rich internship experience by getting students actively involved in many of the day to day functions of our office. This is an excellent opportunity for students to receive training and gain experience in a practical setting. Many networking opportunities exist for our law interns. Additional hands-on training such as the trying of traffic and misdemeanor cases is available for those students who have received 711 certification pursuant to Rule 711 of the Illinois Supreme Court (any law school student who has successfully completed two years of law school may apply to the Illinois Supreme Court for a limited law license which allows the student to actually try cases on the behalf of the supervising agency).

Without having the luxury of paid internships, our scheduling is flexible to accommodate supplemental employment. Morning and early afternoon hours are critical in our office, however interns may arrange their schedules in such a way that mid-afternoon and evening hours are available for employment.
